Overview

This document will go over the process of using the iPad at the Pupillary Distance station on clinic.

PD Measurements

Once you have searched for the patient you will be brought to the PD Measurements page. The first section is labelled “Patient Information” and has the following fields.

CID – The clinic ID number for this specific patient.

Name – First and last name of patient.

DOB – The patient’s date of birth in MM/DD/YYYY format.

Group – The school, group, or community the patient is with.

Photo – Consent to media consent or not.

Allergies – Any allergies will be listed here.

Please confirm their first and last name, date of birth, as well as any allergies. This is a very important step so please don’t forget!

The next section is labeled “RX Glasses Types and Instructions” and has the following fields.

Product Prescribed – Type in if patient is getting one or two pairs.

Pair 1 – Enter a brief description of the first pair. The dropdown to the right will have the options of Single Vision, Lenses, and Bifocal. The field to the right is for “Wear Instructions.” Here you can enter if this pair should be worn full time, worn for six months, etc.

Pair 2 – Enter a brief description of the second pair (if there is one.) The dropdown to the right will have the options of Single Vision, Lenses, and Bifocal. The field to the right is for “Wear Instructions.” Here you can enter if this pair should be worn full time, worn after six months, etc.
